<u>The German-Baltic Conference 2023: What is the goal?</u>

Before the German-Baltic Conference, the German-Baltic Youth Exchange Network met in Lüneburg to prepare the program for our big German-Baltic Conference in Tartu 2023. As of this year, we have the vast theme "Sustainable communication and media usage in international youth work". As a result of the GBYEN Meeting in Lüneburg, we will tackle two topics in Tartu:

- 1. How to develop a catch-all image as a youth organization?
- 2. Media usage as a youth organization

During the Tartu Conference, participants can collaborate in smaller groups to explore one of the abovementioned topics. The German-Baltic Conference aims to create digital guidelines on these topics and equip youth organizations with practical communication tools to spread their message. As the future belongs to the youth, it is crucial to establish communication methods that benefit them and the environment. By working together, we can build a better world for the next generation.

The two branches of the conference

Apart from the German-Baltic Youth Exchange Network, there will also be workshops of our youth ambassadors. Therefore, the conference is divided into two subcategories: workshops of the Youth Ambassadors and the German Baltic Youth Exchange Network meetings. The Keynote speeches are open to all participants and intend to give impulses for the clusters and the network. Also, the opening and closing Ceremonies will be attended by all.

The Youth Ambassadors aim to establish policy papers. For that, we have four clusters. The heads of cluster will work with selected youth ambassadors online between June and September and will complete the policy papers at the conference in Tartu. The theme of this year's cluster work is "Freedom as a shared European value" and each cluster will focus on a specific subtopic within this theme.

The clusters are divided as follows:

- Cluster A: "Environmental Freedom"
- Cluster B: "Freedom of Speech"
- Cluster C: "Freedom of Movement"
- Cluster D: "Freedom of Creative Expression"

Our GBYEN-Workshops

1. How to develop a catch-all image as a youth organization?

The first topic tackles the issue of image building or even brand building as a youth organization. For that, we will not only talk about visual implications but also concentrate on language and how to convey your message as an organization efficiently. Therefore, one of the questions we might tackle could be how a youth organization can create or build an image of inclusion and equality on its communication channels.

2. Media usage as a youth organization

The second topic tackles, more specifically, the visual aspect of being a youth organization. We will discuss how to use the mysterious "Social Media" world as efficiently as possible. Therefore, we discuss do's and don'ts and allow you to work on your visual and online image as a youth organization with one of our experts.

Travel expenses

Please, first, organize your tickets and pay for them yourself. Then collect all receipts or payment confirmations/tickets and forward them to us via email or with the final registration for that conference. **We can only compensate for costs that we have proof of.** Also, if possible, try to issue tickets in German or English with your name, surname, the date and price. After the in-person conference in Tartu, it will take about 4-6 business days to reimburse you for your expenses.
